| What is the status of the Mabury interchange? Is it mid-2020? | We will follow up with the City of San Jose. |

| Are the 2016 Measure B funds coming in as expected? | Yes. |
| For local streets projects will they be funded only with Measure B? Are there other funds? | Measure B funds will be leveraged with local share of the gas tax that is returned to the cities. San José also has another local sales tax for road repairs. |
| Where has the funding for BART Phase II come from to fund work to date? | 2000 Measure A has been funding the environmental and planning phases of BART Phase II. |
| Who makes the decisions for the bike projects in 2016 Measure B? | Ultimately the VTA Board. That said, there will be a screening process using criteria. Then the ranked projects will go through the Committee process prior to Board action. |
| Will the bike budget be zero during any cycle? | VTA budgets on a 2-year cycle. There hasn't been a zero allocation to bike funding yet, but it could be possible under the rules as long as the full allocation is ultimately spent in the 30-year program timeframe. |
| What is the total for the highway program? | \$750 million |
| Can the transit operations funding be used for the current VTA budget deficit? | No. |

Is VTA planning to help construct the trail and donate the right-ofway? | VTA plans to sell the City the right-of-way "at cost" which is considerably lower than it would be today. The area around the station will be a joint planning effort, and the costs of elements are being worked on in partnership with the City. |
